"These are any two colours opposite each other on the colour wheel; yellow and purple, orange and blue, fuchsia and chartreuse." (Young 1). <br> 2. After we have selected which flowers to use, it's time to choose a base. There are many different kinds of bases from glass to ceramic, and even wood. Choose one which complements your flowers and color scheme. <br> B.
